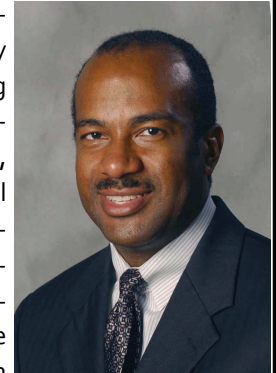
Spotlight on Black Faculty Members

GARY S. MAY

Steve W. Chaddick School Chair, Professor

Becoming a National Society of Black Engineers collegiate member through the Georgia Tech chapter in 1981, Dr. Gary S. May, the Chair of the School of Electrical and Computer Engineering here at Georgia Tech, has been an integral part of the success of NSBE over almost three decades. He believes the Georgia Tech Chapter of the National Society of Black Engineers provides a focal point on the campus for minority students, particularly Black students, to learn the importance of professionalism and how to network amongst like-minded students. May recognizes that for a student to be successful in and out of class requires one to have an initiative to work hard and play hard, exhibiting a well balanced life style wherein they can communicate their ideas efficiently and effectively to other individuals. Many people who know of May realize that he truly practices what he preach to students each and everyday. This can be seen in the many accomplishments May has had over his career in time.

May served in many positions for the National Society of Black Engineers including the following: chapter treasurer, chapter vice president, chapter president, National Vice Chair (1985-1987), National Chair (1987-1989), National Advisory Board (1993-present). Not only has he achieved many goals within NSBE, but also within Georgia Tech. As a faculty member for Georgia Tech, Gary S. May has been an assistant professor (1991), associate professor (1995), full professor (2000), associate chair (2001), executive assistance to Georgia Tech President G. Wayne Clough (2002-2005), and currently, chair of the School of Electrical and Computer Engineering. May stated that President Clough was his best boss he ever had because he had a high level vision and

FOCUS ON PCI (PRE-COLLEGIATE INITIATIVE)

Pre-Collegiate Initiative, PCI, is a component of NSBE whose main goal is extend the pipeline to the youth by getting middle and high school students interested in STEM subjects (science, technology, engineering, and math) and involved in NSBE. NSBE Jr. chapters (the actual junior chapter of NSBE) can be established at any school or local community center. GTSBE currently has 10 of these NSBE Jr. chapters all over metro Atlanta which includes the following schools:

GTSBE's PCI chapters have participated in the local, regional, and national Try-Math-a-Lon (with some of our teams placing 1st, 2nd, and/or 3rd), PCI fashion shows, and many of our PCI students have been torchbearers (which is a 3.0 GPA or better). GTSBE's PCI students are amazing and that is why October is PCI Month.

did not micro manage. May views him as a significant mentor who has offered an immense amount of career advice and networking. Under his leadership as the Chair of the School of Electrical and Computer Engineering, the school has moved into the top 5 rankings. Also, the school produces more ECE degrees than any other ECE school.

Realizing the necessity to encourage minority students to go beyond undergraduate school, May was inspired to provide students with information to teach them about graduate school and how to “fish” for methods to navigate a successful graduate career. As founder of the Georgia Tech Summer Undergraduate Research in Engineering/Science Program (SURE) and the Facilitating Academic Careers in Engineering and Science Program (FACES), May began the program based on a similar program known as SUPERB that he and some of his friends began at the University of California at Berkeley, where he attained his M.S. and Ph.D. degrees. In addition, he has obtained many distinctions - such as Georgia Tech Outstanding Undergraduate Research Mentor Award (2004), IEEE Fellow (2005), NSBE Golden Torch Award: Janice A. Lumpkin Educator of the Year (2006), and many more.

May wants minority students to recognize what a privilege it is to have African American staff and faculty members. He encourages students to utilize their available resources and interact with the African American staff and faculty members. May is a true testament to how becoming involved with NSBE and seeking and taking advantage of opportunities can lead to a successful life.

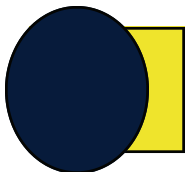
